2. Principal's report

- Grade 6 EQAO results from last year (students in grade 7 now) were sent home over the last two weeks
- In collaboration with PHHS and the daycare, Hawkins will be running a Food & Toiletries drive for the Fareshare foodbank and Rose Quest. Two Christmas trees will be set up in the PHHS; drive will run Dec 4 – 18; Kickoff assembly on Tuesday November 28 with the students; Rose Quest is asking for full size toiletries; LLS students will help sort the donations
- Trustees and Superintendent will have their annual visit to the school on Tuesday November 28
- Students will be able to take part in a school skating event (free); school divided into two groups and 1x/week for the last three weeks in December will walk down to JBSC. Students will need helmets and skates, but can be borrowed if we have notice; permission forms will go home soon.
- PHHS is hosting their Open House on Wednesday November 29, 630-8pm in library, December 7 is when course selection opens; French Immersion is same date at CCI, unknown when course selection will be
- Grade 8s will be participating in the Innovation Project PHHS applied for a grant to help get kids to promote PHHS and stay in Port Hope. For this project, students will look up different UN concerns in the world and come up with ideas on how to solve the problem, then design a prototype to solve the problem, coding, solar, wind, options etc; Dec 14 build day in the PHHS gym; Judges will vote on best solution and the winners will be able to build their design
- Class bins were purchased for each class to help distribute items
- Booklists from teachers are coming in for what to purchase for the library with our fundraising money

- Grade 8 trip update; only about 30 students have said they will go to date; permission forms won't go home until closer to event; Money raised through the chocolate sales must be returned asap as there is a lot of money still outstanding
- School spirit wear will be available in the future
- Grad committee to come together after March Break for planning the graduation event

- Lots of sports and clubs are ongoing; area meet for Volleyball very soon, basketball, hockey and more starting in January
- Lots of classes heading to the Outdoor Education Centre
